Kartell Goes Sottsass A Tribute To Memphis



Kartell pays homage to Ettore Sottsass with a collection of original projects (vases, stools and a lamp) expressly designed for the company by the great master, some of which will also be placed in production. For the occasion, Kartell is organizing an event to celebrate Memphis, one of Sottsass' greatest adventures, and dedicating its Fuorisalone exhibition signed by Ferruccio Laviani: a vibrant and energetic scenic design at the Flagship Store Kartell, Milan, all centered on the typical post-futurist aesthetics of the famed design movement. The exhibition will also feature Kartell soft seatings, covered with fabric from the Memphis collection.

Kartell loves to dare, revolutionize, to thrill. It loves to surprise.

The thrill can derive from a technological

innovation or a new aesthetic trend in its products. Very often indeed, it is a question of a blending of both.

But when these aspects give life to the ideas and visions of great designers who have in the past left their unmistakable mark on the international design scene, here one has Kartell proceeding with true and proper cultural revolutions.

Today is the day of an unexpected encounter. Today Ettore Sottsass lives again with his extraordinary creativity thanks to some original projects designed for Kartell in 2004 hitherto unproduced.

Thus, Kartell has once again brought Sottsass and Memphis together in a triumph of signs and color, where for the first time 8 vases/tabourets and a lamp by Ettore Sottsass will be on display, while the

fabrics of the Memphis collection will give an unexpected pop post-futurist image to some of the upholstered products in the Kartell catalogue, such as Mademoiselle by Philippe Starck, Foliage by Patricia Urquiola, and Trix by Piero Lissoni.

Indeed an epoch making encounter between Kartell and the great Master of Design who lives again in his revolutionary design, for the first time seen with an industrial slant. Sottsass was typically tied to the idea of the one-off piece, Kartell's vocation in turn is that of investing strongly in technology and industrial processes in order to give life to a design icon reproducible in thousands of copies. As well as an exquisitely formal and artistic level, the encounter with Sottsass is unusual in terms of the scope of the design project. Some of the new Sottsass icons by Kartell

will in fact be produced industrially and will be available all over the world.

Claudio Luti, President of Kartell, comments: "we are particularly proud this year to present some original objects that Ettore Sottsass designed for Kartell in 2004 but that we have never produced. We have recovered them today wishing, with an event and with some special products, to celebrate a piece of design history. I believe that Sottsass with Memphis truly enabled me during the course of my entrepreneurial career, even unintentionally so, to draw from the free creative expression of designers devoid of codes and undue formalisms. Today as well, technology enables us to realize Sottsass' designs with a quality and sophistication that would have been







impossible ten years ago. This celebration and this new manufacturing commitment demonstrate once more how Kartell goes beyond transitory styles and trends. With its design and its versatility, it manages to cross eras and cultures, to give shape to the ideas of designers, turning them into lasting objects. I am convinced that the maestro would have been enthusiastic as to how we have given life to his objects, that are one of a kind, unmistakable, some of which will be projected towards a totally industrial and international future. In this sense the tribute to their creator will be even more long lasting, achieving the return to the factory Ettore Sottsass wished for".

Alberto Bianchi Albrici, sole administrator of Memphis adds: "I find this cooperation with Kartell highly interesting. Kartell will allow us to enter, to make ourselves known and appreciated in millions of homes where we could never have been. And this is a good thing for all".












Ferruccio Laviani, architect and designer concludes: "Managing to have prototyped Sottsass' objects and create a Memphis event, along with customizing some of the products of the Kartell Catalogue, has enabled me to pay a small homage to Ettore Sottsass and Barbera Radici, who I had the opportunity to work with in the past. Undoubtedly that incredible experience, which I was lucky enough to be involved in, and that has undeniably marked my way of working, of seeing things, and what I am professionally today, a bit of them and of all the people who look part in has remained part of me."

The protagonists of the collection are 6 vases, 2 stools and a lamp whose shapes and colors clearly declare their Sottsass origins: each protagonist modulates postfuturist volumes and shapes and is lit up by bright pop colors (such as red, acid green, pink, glossy white and black).

The collection is rounded off by a suspension lamp named Daisy, original for its application of a series of tesseras in plastic, rectangular in shape, with typical Sottsass colors and a central disk in black thermoplastic techno polymer.



banks, museums, hospitals, libraries, cruise ships and have also followed designs for cafés, restaurants, hotels, residences, nursing homes, schools.



Designed by Bavuso Giuseppe, the Bahia sofa's base is in wood covered in non-







"The blocks are based on vehicles. The forms give the tactile and visual impression of classic building blocks with familiar, basic shapes.

As with Arche Toys, I looked for the essence of the vehicles, but this time I wanted to allow more space for imagination and individuality.

By changing, moving or flipping the blocks, new combinations and images arise. They are kind of design tools.

The use of color and the decision to make 3D light beams, creates a gentle image, reminiscent of comic drawings and old-fashioned colors. The blocks are designed to be attractive both for children and adults."

]02[HAPPY BIRD BY EERO AARNIO

"When 25 years ago we moved to Veikkola, which is situated 30km away from Helsinki, we could not have imagined the diversity of the wildlife in that area. One day we saw a moose, which is the largest animal in Finland with very big horns, swim across the lake. The most dangerous animal in Finland is the bear and once, our neighbor saw a


bear within 100meters of our house. Few years ago we left the Christmas ham in the porch outside our house overnight to keep it cold and in the morning the cover of the container was removed and half of the ham eaten; it was a Christmas for the fox also! Overwhelmingly the most abundant animal species in the area are birds and with the help of a bird book, we have already identified 30 different types of birds around our house. The largest birds are swans and herons, which migrate north in the spring. Because our house is located by the lake and we often sit on the shore, the local ducks have become frequent visitors hoping to catch something to eat from us. These stories show why animals play such an important role in my designs.

For a long time, we have been feeding birds that don't migrate south before the winter and they have become like well-loved friends and it seems like the feelings are mutual. We feel like every bird is a "Happy Bird"."

"Playful, enchanting, but also dynamic:

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these are the attributes to describe the products in the Wild Bunch collection, which offers a natural and functional approach and an amusing, friendly and versatile style, suitable for the widest range of spaces and situations.

Like all the products in the collection, Cuckoo table features a combination of a solid beech frame and injection-moulded polypropylene joints, on which a round top with a diameter of 120cm is placed."

]05[and **]06[** MILLÀ BY JAIME HAYÓN "Imagine you're able to do in plastic what is impossible to be in wood.

With the expertise of Magis as pioneers in gas injection – molding, we were able to make an expressive chair very rich in movement, based on the forms of Catalan modernism: elastic and dynamic. We created a truly elegant plastic chair, something to stand out on a saturated market.

It's a challenge for me, as someone who normally uses materials with thousands of years of heritage such as wood, metal and ceramic, to create my first product in plastic. And I am happy with it."

]07[SAM SON BY KONSTANTIN GRCIC

"Sam Son is an easy armchair with a hint of a cartoon character. Supported on four stilt legs, the armchair features a softly suspended seat shell between a giant horseshoe- shaped element, the chair's characteristic armrest and backrest.

Made from two different rotational moldings, the armchair combines a rigid plastic for its base and more elastic polymer for the upper part.

The exaggerated size of the armrest and backrest provides comfort and support and creates a protective space for sitting. Sam Son comes in four different colors and is suitable for both indoors and outdoors."

]08[TROTTER BY ROGIER MARTENS

This mobile chair for children is made of steel rod and a rotation-molded wheel. The conspicuous wheel is an invitation for children to be active, because it makes it easy to move the chair to the best spot, over and over again.

]09[STANLEY BY PHILIPPE STARCK

"The elegance of high technology to rediscover the timeless "director" chair."











]10[TRAFFIC TABLE BY KONSTANTIN GRCIC

"Following the entire collection of upholstered seating launched in 2013, which was joined last year by the coffee tables, again with a metal rod frame, now comes the turn of Traffic table.

Playing on different proportions, the basic concept of Traffic is elaborated in a new form: once again, we find slender steel rod frames that create soft geometric volumes, giving rise this time to a sizeable table/trestle, ideal for both domestic and contact settings."

]11[SUBSTANCE BY NAOTO

FUKASAWA

"I wanted to try working on a chair that has a simple cross junction of two U-shaped legs. Then, I wanted to put a simple shell on top.

Combining the beginning details of the legs and the bottom curve of the shell of this chair creates such a friendly feeling.

It is common to have a chair with a shell and legs that extend off the shell whereas this bending detail on Substance gives a fresh quality.

I believe we have successfully produced a sustainable chair. The same goes for the tables. This combination of bent legs and the table top creates a warm environment."

This year, Magis presented the extension of the Cyborg family with the introduction of an exciting new variation.

In 1960, the scientist, inventor and musician, Manfred Clynes coined the term Cyborg, which then grew ever more popular thanks to innumerable sci-fi novels and films; it designates an organism that combines natural and artificial elements.

Marcel wanders interprets this fusion as the expression of a continuous search for new combinations, in today's world, where it seems there is nothing truly new left to invent. The original concept behind Marcel Wander's Cyborg armchair for Magis is to join a polycarbonate base with backs in different materials. Extending this concept,











the latest Cyborg introduces a back made of woven cane, an intricate, artisan inspired material. Additional seat cushions in a range of fine fabrics are now available for all Cyborg armchairs.

Forging, the process used to shape iron, pressing it between the hammer and anvil, has a history that stretches back over millennia. Throughout the ages, this technique has been used to create

an infinite number of everyday objects and decorative artifacts. The officinal collection of tables explores the possibility of establishing a new creative language while working with an ancient fabrication process such as iron forging.

After the tables, this year, the collection expands to include a chair and stools that echo the forged iron structure of the tables, combined with shells in a range of different materials. with those slight imperfections that make each piece in this collection unique, with an unmistakably industrial feel, but combined with a profoundly refined and elegant spirit.



The Flaxx chair is a hybrid design which offers the comfort of a free-swinging chair as well as the functionality of a conventional four-legged chair. The novel structure of the support frame and the combination of advantages from both designs is a contemporary interpretation in both form and function.

The seat shell is made from natural fiber mats, which are molded into a stable three- dimensional form by pressing multiple layers of the material. The mats predominantly consist of flax, an annually renewable raw material, and are held together by textile polypropylene as an adhesive. The seat shell and frame are made of 100% recyclable materials.

Lilo, the first of the new products for 2015, hints at references to Scandinavian style, to the modernist idea of the 1950s and the

work of the great masters of design. The classic wood frame is revamped in a modern and soft armchair, to give an idea of pure relaxation. A bold aesthetic borrowed from the rugged wood structure, which supports the weight of the upholstery positioned according to ergonomics to ensure the ideal support for every area of the body. The slight slant of the back followed by the elongated shape of the armrests accompanies the resting, almost prone, position. Lilo, soft and accommodating, demonstrates effectively and at the same time a versatility of use, which makes it perfect for public spaces and in the home.

The collection is a study of form and an exploration of the primary composition required to support the body in space. Beginning with two circular supports - 'Double Zero' – (the seat and the back), the

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chair is enclosed in a series of metal loops that suspend the two elements, so that they appear to float.

JO6[X-CHAIR BY RICHARD HUTTEN: A CHAIR DESIGNED FROM THE BACKSIDE Chairs are most seen from the back, since they are facing the (coffee) table or each other. But most chairs are designed from the front. Not the Mix chair. The Mix chair looks iconic from the side you will see it most: it's back. On this side you see a big X which connects the seat and the back.

The Mix chair is extra wide to be more inviting and generous. It is extra round to be more friendly and mobile. It's round shapes are a dreamy mix of cyber space and nature. Glider: fun and sensuality, function and stage presence concentrated in a generous, full, bold form. The challenge was not to build a traditional sofa with back, seat and armrests, but to start from a single volume, a single piece, and model it to make it as comfortable as a classic sofa.

The tub is then formed in a sort of cut which shapes the front part of the sofa, outlining soft and welcoming lines, to which a rocking structure can be added to transform the sofa into a swing, combining the experience of movement with comfort.

JOSE OTTOMAN BY SCHOLTEN & BAIJINGSThe textile design 'Blocks & Grid' for Maharam was reason for Scholten & Baijings to study in depth the suitability of the fabric designed for this project. By









using the fabric design on scale models of existing furniture, it was possible to thoroughly examine the pattern's effect. It became evident how the pattern had to be defined in order to obtain exciting compositions with a clear color expression for each separate cut of fabric.

Gradually, the need arose to design a new piece of furniture especially for the 'Blocks & Grid' fabric. It is interesting and challenging for designers to personally determine the context for the fabric. A new fabric for a new way of sitting. This new way of sitting will probably be more like lying. The seat height is lower than usual, and the furniture's open design allows for more freedom of movement. Spatial dimensions, layered patterns and color use are central considerations in the fabric design. Scholten & Baijings' first sketches and scale models consist of soft, rectangular 'Daybeds' that offer multiple uses: sitting, leaning against, lounging or lying down, alone or with each other. The use of futons, as customary in typically Japanese rooms, served as an important source of inspiration.

In the second sketch phase, the idea emerged to use the old Ottoman Empire as an imaginative starting point. A footstool is also called an Ottoman. Ottoman history provides many magnificent examples of decorative interior fabrics in combination with low seating elements, intended to encourage social interaction among people. Images evoked are those of tea drinking, the use of a waterpipe, or the enjoyment of a shared meal. In addition, numerous examples exist of fabric designs in vibrant colors and with clear graphic patterns, used in wide-open, spacious interiors.

The furniture design is unlike that of the fabric. The Ottoman's design is characterized by rounder, softer and more organic forms. This is in contrast with the fabric's angular color compositions and creates a magnificent symbiosis. However, both designs also work very effectively on their own.



Husk is inspired by the outer shell of corn. The fields of corn punctuate the landscape of northern Italy, in particular around the city of Udine. Corn is used as a resource globally across all borders and takes many forms. For Thorpe, this was an opportunity to translate the architecture of the husk from an ear of corn to produce a globally recognizable and accepted object for daily use. The design of Husk for the home collection of Moroso lent itself to the international sensibility of the outdoor collection M'Afrique, manufactured in Dakar, Senegal.

]11[IMBA BY FEDERICA CAPITANI

Imba's origin comes from the playful combination of two flowing, intertwined loops. The geometry of the inner loop uses a closed woven pattern that provides comfort for the seat and backrest. The external loop, gently wrapped around the seat, creates a space frame for a semi-open weaving that offers intimate space, yet open at the same time.

Made in Dakar, Africa, Imba is an attempt to translate the warm quality of hand crafted, unique artifacts into a collection that invites you for a relaxing moment and a casual conversation with friends.

]12[MATCH # BY BEN VAN BERKEL

The Match# Chair and Table set is designed for use in a variety of public and private spaces: in educational facilities, hospitality areas, large meeting and conference rooms, as well as in dining spaces.

]14[ST MARK BY MARTINO GAMPER

A chair which owes its name to a square in London, for which the design was initially commissioned. St. Mark is a simplified, modern take on the traditional bent wood café chair. The chair is strong, easy to use



and it stacks. Its profile traces a continuous curved line from behind the legs through the back. It is available in natural ash and a selection of colors.

]15[TEO BY ATELIER OÏ

In cooperation with Moroso, Atelier Oï pursued the idea of a multi-purpose piece of furniture and designed TEO, a multi-faceted sofa system that can adapt to a vast variety of requirements in a semi-public space. Moreover, it also provides a solution to various co-habitation situations in a home environment.

In the development phase, the main focus lay on a design inspired by the concept of a bridge. The aesthetic quality of its statics resulted in a base with a filigree and airy appearance, nonetheless providing significant stability and spanning a remarkable distance. The foot part was made to look like an elegant, graceful but stable looking shoe heel.

The formal design of TEO's base enables the extraordinary presentation of its upholstery reminiscent of a gap being bridged and a precious load being carried.

Its reductionist aesthetics highlight the

exceptional quality materials used: the textiles, leather, marble and metal base are of outstanding quality and their plain finish emphasises the sofa's design details in the best of ways.

TEO's versatility draws its strength from the system's ingenuity that allows it to react to a number of customer needs and space requirements. Its distinctive aluminium profile constitutes its defining feature and allows for a number of different typologies to be configured. The surfaces can be integrated to the program as table elements.

116 BOLD BY PATRICIA URQUIOLA

Bold, a sofa with a simple, balanced and functional elegance for a "timeless" quality. Attention is then drawn to the value of the upholstery, the quality of the finishes and details, the small adjustments made to make the experience of beauty daily (and normal). Patricia Urquiola has created with Moroso a product made up of soft upholstery, which thins out towards the edges, where the stitching is accented to define the distinguishing features of this product.

Fiam

Born from One Man's Passion for Glass







Vittorio Livi. In 1962, when he was 18 years old, he established "Fullet" to produce decorated glasses earmarked for the furniture industry. Then followed: 1964 Artiglass, 1966 Curvovetro, 1967 Cromoglass and 1969 Vellutart.

In 1973, while he was setting up all these companies, he established "Fiam Italia", the first company able to perform curved glass furniture items, which most well known international designers cooperate with. Among these there are: Giorgetto Giugiaro, Enzo Mari, Philippe Starck, Ron Arad, Cini Boeri, Vico Magistretti, Makio Hasuike, etc.

Fiam Italia, worldwide leader on its field, distributes its own collection all over the world and some of its products are hosted by 25 international museums.

In 1988, together with Massimo and Alberta Ferretti, they established the "Montegridolfo srl" to reorganize the homonym walled-in suburb dating back to VII century B.C., which was crumbling and brought back to the ancient brightness. In 1992, he bought "Villa Miralfiore",

Pesaro's historical building dating back to 1260, that has marked the historical stages of these places by the nobles that have lived there. It crumbled and was recovered together with its own typical Italian garden.

A part of "Villa Mirafiore" was used as a museum to host glass works produced by himself in cooperation with some artists such as: Gianni Colombo, Arnaldo Pomodoro, Enrico Baj, Walter Valentini, Danny Lane, Umberto Mariani, Eugenio Carmi, Luigi Veronesi, Bruno Munari, Oscar Piattella and Vasco Bendini.

Fiam designs, develops and produces items of furniture in curved glass, creating them through a combination of craftsmanship and industrial processes, actually merging tradition and innovation, hand-crafting and design. Glass, solid and





fragile, natural and artificial, ancient and industrial, all at the same time, is a mass of seeming contradictions, and Livi loved it for just that, as well as for its practical qualities. Glass is environment-friendly and hygienic: it may look simple, because of its transparency, but both its chemistry and its physics are really very complex. And this material of vast potential was virtually only used in the world of furniture for the production of small accessories or ornaments. And so in the young Vittorio Livi's creative mind, a dream began to take shape:

Glass would become a unique star in the world of fine design, being used to produce items of furniture which would be astonishingly solid yet beautifully transparent; design items which would





rise above the age of their production, untouched by the passing years, spaces and fashions. From its earliest days, Fiam immediately focused on innovation as the driving force for achieving its business and cultural aims. This innovation would proceed on three fronts.

The success of the complex process by which glass is transformed into the finished product relies on the experience of skilled craftsmen, who carry out various operations: silver-coating, bending, decoration, fusion, engraving, grinding and carving. A professional glassmaker, capable of predicting, quantifying, controlling and finding the right alternatives in every single case.

During the bending process, the master craftsman's experience and his ability to





work in perfect harmony with the furnace operator are fundamental for controlling the shapes produced and the success of the operation.

Fiam sees a designer's ability to take risks with shapes as a welcome challenge to its technical expertise. The company has even created one-off technologies to produce some pieces. For example, in

1982, Massimo Morozzi came up with the design for the Hydra coffee table, with very pronounced shapes that would be difficult to obtain with the machinery then available. So Fiam invented a special machine called the Paser, capable of pushing water and abrasive powder to a speed of one thousand meters a second – three times the speed of sound! And to produce the Illusion table by Philippe





Starck, Fiam had to create a plant capable of processing glass at one thousand degrees.

At Fiam, the master craftsman is considered just as important as the designer in the piece's creation. In spite of the state-of-the-art technology used to forge it, the finished item is unique: a crafted work of art.



For the Love of Bulbs by Ingo Maurer

Ingo Maurer started to design exceptional lamps, lighting systems and objects beginning in the middle of the 1960s, which his company produces and distributes worldwide. This is why they can realize their ideas without compromises.



For over four working decades, Ingo Maurer and Team – as he refers to the coworkers – has constantly grown. They are now a group of more than sixty people. The address in Munich, Schwabing has remained the same since 1970. However, in 2005, they outgrew their production facilities in the courtyard at Kaiserstrasse 47 and a new location for production and shipping was established on the outskirts of Munich. In the former production hall, Ingo Maurer and his team created a spacious showroom, the second after New York and the only one in Europe.

Their project department has steadily

evolved from the design of exhibitions at trade fairs, festivities and special installations of the lighting system YaYaHo. Ingo Maurer takes on commissions for lighting as well as interior light-planning. In addition to the sales of their regular products, the projects are now an important part of their activities. The challenges they pose have often been invigorating and inspiring, both through the people involved and the spaces that are to be designed. The projects permit Ingo Maurer to realize his ideas for artistic installation or lighting objects, providing at the same time intriguing and pleasant

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spaces for those who will live or work in them.

Since he started to work as a lighting designer, Ingo Maurer has always collaborated closely with the photographers entrusted with the creation of images of lamps and project works. In the 1960s, Angelika von Mutius was the main photographer, later Christof Piepenstock, both located in Munich. Since, it has been many years that Ingo Maurer works with Tom Vack.

J01[BULB BY INGO MAURER, 1966Bulb designed in 1966, was included in 1969 into the permanent design collection of the MoMA in New York. Photographs include a vintage one of the Munich Kaiserstrasse 47 location which at the time was the early "Factory Outlet". Polished chromium- plated metal base and handblown crystal glass from Murano.

]02[I RICCHI POVERI BZZZZ BY INGO MAURER. 2014

Bzzzz is a member of the new tribe of lamps called Ricchi Poveri, presented by Ingo Maurer in April 2014. It is a group of objects with an unpretentious and simple yet highly powerful expression that came straight from the heart. Dragonfly is made of anodized aluminum in red, green or blue, steel, brass and a low-voltage halogen bulb.

JO3[I RICCHI POVERI - MONUMENT FOR A BULB BY INGO MAURER, 2014 Monument for a Bulb is an intriguing small lighting object that looks like a tiny maquette for a huge monument. Eight human figures are standing on a dark metal plate around the monument: the frosted bulb hovers horizontally, propped up by simple brass. Each of the human figures is cast in nickel silver and fixed on the plate.

]04[LUCELLINO LED BY INGO MAURER, 2015

At first glance, Lucellino LED seems to be nothing else but Ingo Maurers well-known trademark which Lucellino presented in 1992. In redesigning Lucellino as LED version, it was a challenge to change as little as possible, except the light source. Not an easy job when the lamp's main elements are a frosted bulb and a pair of white wings!

The new light source has been created by the Japanese company Toshiba Materials, which developed highly sophisticated LED technology for Ingo Maurer's iconic design in direct cooperation with Ingo Maurer personally. TRI-R, as the product is named, does not only look like a frosted bulb from the outside, but also dims like an incandescent bulb.

Average dimmable LED retrofit bulbs, become less bright when dimmed, while the TRI-R bulb also changes the color, just like halogen bulbs do. The bright spot of the bulbs become reddish. Also, it is actually in the middle of the bulb, not next to the socket. When defining the color rendering, Toshiba Materials used the solar spectrum as a reference standard. The new LED bulb for Lucellino is the first full-fledged replacement for all admirers of the light bulb, hardly distinguishable from a halogen bulb and a technological masterpiece.

The base plate of the new Lucellino is equipped with a touch sensor for switching and continuous dimming.

]05[I RICCHI POVERI – FLY BY INGO MAURER, 2014

I Ricchi Poveri – Fly is a new member of The I Ricchi Poveri, a tribe of simple yet refined lights, hand-made, unboastful and exceptional. A large fly sits cheekily on a lying bulb. The insect, looking just like a real one, joins a long series of "disgusting" creatures Ingo Maurer has included in some of his lamps lighting object, like Seven Rats, created in 2007. The new LED bulb, developed for Lucellino will also be used
